Kay shares recommendations on keeping members active in the church such as writing down fears or prayers and dissolving them or burning them.

Sunday March 14th, 2021

Elstad Lutheran Church

The meeting was called to order by President Dick Haight at 7:19 pm.

Roll call: all members were present. A Quorum was called.

The agenda was reviewed. A motion to approve the revised agenda was made by Jennifer second by Amber. Motion passed.

Tom Dybing was present to share information he received from Dean Berland at Highland Church to the council.

The Pastor's report was given.

Taping continues at Highland Prairie. There was a microphone problem last Wednesday. 2 online prayer services a week continue. Confirmation will take place on May 2nd. Holy week is approaching. Youth have been doing weekly take home assignments totaling in 18. Adult book study continues. Synod assembly will take place on May 8th. Pastor Luther, Dick and Diane Haight will be attending from Elstad Lutheran Church. Pastor continues to meet members outside of the church. Waiting on Good Shepherd to resume visits there.

Pastor shares concerns related to the pandemic and the future of worship.

The treasurer's report was reviewed and placed on file for audit at a later date. The PPE loan was approved. We are indebted to Jennifer for her work.

Old Business:

Church Repairs- There is a sign up sheet in the back of the church for small church repairs members can sign up for. This will be added to the bulletin and the church newsletter. We could also make this available for the younger members to see through Facebook.

Tom Dybing also spoke of the large cracks in the cement leading up to the stairs. President Dick Haight will contact Jessie Rein regarding this concern.

Sunday School - Krissy and Amber share that the Sunday school has been meeting in person since February 21st using Shared Faith for prek - 8th grade. This is also available to families not attending in person. The expense was taken care of by the Sunday School funds. Highland prairie was invited to piggy back, however we have not heard back from Chelsie at Highland prairie.

New Business

Dean shared with Tom that a rain guard micro seal was used and could be purchased on Amazon. It is a water repellant not waterproof. This would keep moisture from going through the wall. The cost is \$78 a quart. It took them 20 gallons. A lift is also needed to spray the higher parts which would cost \$300 - \$400. They paid \$200 - \$250 for the person applying it. In total it cost \$850 for them to do this. This may need to be done every 4-5 years. Dean estimated to Tom that it would cost roughly \$1000 to complete today. Tom will look into this more.

Jennifer made a motion to look into the rain guard micro seal and Krissy second. Motion passed

Secretary's report was given. Motion was given by Amber, second by Kathy. Motion passed.

Motion was made by President Dick Haight to adjourn, second by Amber. The meeting was adjourned at 8:11 pm.

A quorum was determined and a motion to approve the agenda as presented was made by Chris Hoiland, Steve Howe seconded. Motion carried.

Devotions were given by Pastor Luther.

There were no congregation members present.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Karen Bakken. The SBA Payroll Protection loan has been forgiven. Year to date information provided are income \$9,744.00 expenses \$ 12,550.00; expenses exceed income by \$2,806.00. A motion to approve as presented was made by Steve Howe, Joyce Dahl, seconded. Motion carried.

The President's Report: Little activity to report.

The Pastor's Report was given by Pastor Luther. One year into COVID we have seen a 30-45% decrease in attendance. Online worship and two prayer services per week continue. The Passion according to Mark will be heard this year with Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Sunday services. Confirmation continues with parental involvement in assignments. May 2nd will be the Rite of Confirmation service. Bible Study continues. Conference Clergy meeting attended online on topic "Pay Attention to What you are Paying Attention To". Invitation given to come and preach. Synod Assembly will be held online. Providing monthly Bible Study at Parklane and looking to provide the same at Good Shepherd once we are allowed; phone calls to shut ins and Communion served as requested, as well as preparations for fall weddings.

Correspondence received: Synod 40 days of food shelf donations, school donation request.

Committee Reports: Grounds and buildings – we need to keep in mind the roof, staining, walkway and stairs, curb and gutter and air conditioners should be looked at.

Old Business: Parking lot – Bid from B & D Sealcoating was received and a decision needs to be made so it can be scheduled for this year. Steve Howe moved to proceed with proposal as presented, David Markegard seconded. Motion carried.

New Business: Discussion on the possibilities of singing during worship, an Easter Breakfast, and Rental of Church facilities for Lind piano recital to following masking and distancing Chris Hoiland, Joyce Dahl seconded. Motion carried.

Good Earth campership fund approval motion to cover 75% of the cost was made by Joyce Dahl, Nancy Rustad seconded. Motion carried at the January council meeting. We will table any further action at this time.

Approval of Auditors – Currently Jenny Stensgard is continuing, Val Howe and Alan Skalet will join as auditors. Steve Howe moved to approve; Chris Hoiland seconded. Motion carried.

The Secretary's report was read and a motion to approve was made by Steve Howe, Karen Bakken seconded. Motion carried.

A motion to adjourn at 6:30 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer was made by Joyce Dahl , Chris Hoiland seconded. Motion carried.

The Pastor's Report:

Pastor Luther thanked the congregation for the time off, it is appreciated. Today was the last Sunday after Epiphany, and Pastor Luther wanted to thank Martha for the music and Bobbi for the technical support. Lent begins this week with Ash Wednesday. Services will be at 5 PM at Elstad, and 7 PM at Highland-Prairie. The Highland-Prairie service will be taped. All midweek Lenten Services following Ash Wednesday will be at 7 PM. beginning with the service on 2/24/21 at Elstad. The theme for Lent this year is "Life together in Christian Community. Members are encouraged to bring canned goods for the local food shelves. Online prayer services will continue on Tuesdays and Thursdays in Lent. A 5 week book study will begin this Thursday (2/18/21) on "A Large Catechism" by Robert Jensen. Confirmation instruction restarted in January with 14 great kids in class. There will not be classroom instruction during Lent, as the students are expected to attend Lenten Services weekly, and work on their memorization work from the small catechism. Pastor Luther attended the Synod meeting this afternoon, where routine business occurred, including electing persons to positions, in the meeting it was discussed that the Synod is having the same issues as congregations today in regards to restrictions, and providing digital access. Pastor Luther indicated that Pastoral Care continues, and communion is available for shut-ins, but strict safety protocols will be observed. Due to continued access restrictions, hospital visits are still not possible. Pastor Luther also noted that the Synod has a "40 days 40 dollars" campaign that will benefit the global mission. He will post the information on Facebook, and add it to the bulletin announcements for individuals whom would like to participate.

Committee Reports: The education committee will be reviewing the online curriculum that Elstad is using, and if they would like to move forward we will be buying the appropriate licenses for Highland-Prairie.
